### FINAL REMINDERS (OPEN RACE)

ARRIVE EARLY! PLEASE PARK LEGALLY IN DESIGNATED SPOTS THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL OR OVERFLOW LOT. IF YOU PARK IN THE MAIN LOT, THERE IS \$5 CHARGE (CASH ONLY). PROCEEDS WILL GO TO ARTESIA HIGH SCHOOL.

#### THERE IS NO BAG CHECK! PLEASE PLAN ACCORDINGLY!

PLEASE PROCEED TO THE PRE-REGISTRATION LINE! LOOK FOR THE SIGN ON THE BLACK NIKE TENT AT THE PARK! THERE WILL BE A SEPARATE LINE FOR ON-SITE REGISTRATION. PLEASE DO NOT WAIT IN THIS LINE IF YOU PRE-REGISTERED.

PLEASE ARRIVE AT CHECK-IN BY 6:45AM! LEAVE AMPLE TIME TO PARK, CHECK-IN AND USE THE RESTROOM. RESTROOMS LOCATED AT THE TRACK AND ON CAMPUS.

AFTER YOU RECEIVE YOUR CHIP AND YOUR BIB, PROCEED TO THE T-SHIRT LINE TO GET YOUR SHIRT! SHIRT SIZES ARE LIMITED SO PLEASE ARRIVE EARLY TO GET YOURS. IF YOU DO NOT PICK UP YOUR SHIRT BEFORE THE RACE, YOU ARE NOT GUARANTEED A SHIRT AS THEY WILL BE OPEN FOR SALE AFTER THE OPEN RACE BEGINS.

IF YOU REGISTERED AS PART OF A TEAM, YOUR BIBS AND TIMING CHIPS MUST BE COLLECTED FROM YOUR COACH/ORGANIZER. TEAM ENTRANTS DO NOT GET A SHIRT UNLESS THEY PAID THE ADDITIONAL FEE. PAYMENT MUST BE RECEIVED BEFORE BIBS ARE RELEASED TO ANY MEMBER OF THE TEAM.

STUDY THE COURSE! PLEASE USE THE MAP TO STUDY THE COURSE. IT IS A CROSS COUNTRY COURSE (NOT A ROAD RACE), THUS NOTE THAT IT WILL BE MARKED WITH FLAGS. THE FLAGS WILL BE COLORED ACCORDING TO THE MILE DESIGNATION ON THE MAP. THERE WILL ALSO BE NUMEROUS SIGNS AND VOLUNTEERS ALONG THE COURSE.

DON'T FORGET YOUR MEDAL! ALL FINISHERS RECEIVE A MEDAL! THERE ARE NO AGE GROUP AWARDS EXCEPT FOR TOP OVERALL, YOUTH AND ALUMNI FOR BOTH MALES AND FEMALES.

AT THE END OF THE RACE, YOU MUST SURRENDER YOUR TIMING CHIP!

- We encourage the child to complete the course on their own. However, an adult may run with or carry their child if needed.
- The course will be a straighaway of about 100m. The finish will be next to the open race finish line.
- Bibs are encouraged, but not required. A button will also be given to all participants in this race.
- Please have your child ready at the start line by 7:45am. We hope to start the race at that time. Late arrivals can run, as long as they arrive by 7:55am, however, the initial race may already have started and been completed.



#### The Story Behind the Great Cow Run

In 1956, the area currently known as Cerritos was incorporated as Dairy Valley. On any given day, you could see cows roaming around the city and the aroma in the morning was not the greatest of wake up calls.

Although the city has developed from those times with the construction of the world famous Cerritos Auto Square, the Los Cerritos Center, the Cerritos Towne Center, the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts and the Cerritos Millennium Library, the city's roots still roam around the city, as the city's transportation system, the COW (Cerritos on Wheels) allows residents to get from one point of the city to another.

The Cerritos Millennium Library was the first public titanium buildings in the continent of North America and cost an estimated \$40 million dollars to construct. Adjacent to the library is the newly created sculpture garden where residents can enjoy the aesthetics of the sculpture art on display.

Year in and year out, the city of Cerritos also is recognized for their excellence in the Tournament of Roses Parade, a proud moment for the city. Also, the city is recognized as a Tree City USA for its emphasis on a park-like atmosphere.

The city has been known to be the second highest retailer in California and was named one of the most diverse cities of its size by a study of Cal Sate Northridge. The city was also one of the first cities to offer city-wide broadband services to its residents at any location in the city, including in their own COW buses.


Cerritos High School is able to boast about its successful alumni's including UCLA Men's Basketball Coach, Ben Howland, Major League Soccer Player Marcelo Balboa, and Blind Date Host, Roger Lodge, just to name a few. The city also was home to the well-known quarterback, Troy Aikman and also to former first lady, Pat Nixon. It also is the home of current celebrities such as Park JaeHyung (Day6), Yoshi & Peter Sudarso (Power Rangers – Former CXC Athletes), Justin Min (Ben – Umbrella Academy), Han Ye-Seul, Roger Lodge (Blind Date/Angels) and Narmak (YouTube Animator).

Also movies such as She's All That, Wayne's World and Coneheads have been shot partially within the city as well as shows such as Dexter and AHS.

With so much progress in recent times, it's hard to imagine that the city began as a dairy farming area, as in where we stand right now, could have been the place that the cows formerly of Dairy Valley called home! Thus, the birth of the Great Cow Run!





#### **Directions to Artesia High School**

12108 Del Amo Blvd. Lakewood, CA 90715

(Please be sure to recheck directions before distributing.)

From the 605 North (Including 405)

Exit on Del Amo Boulevard
Make a right off the exit onto Del Amo.
Please drop athletes off in front of the school on Del Amo Blvd.
Athletes should proceed to the track.

From the 605 South (Including 5 South/105 South)

Exit on Del Amo Blvd
Left off the Exit
Please drop athletes off in front of the school on Del Amo Blvd.
Athletes should proceed to the track.

From the 5 North
Take the 91 West
Exit on Valley View Street
Right off Exit
Left on Orangethorpe Ave. (South Street)
Left on Pioneer Blvd.
Left on Del Amo Blvd.
Please drop athletes off in front of the school on Del Amo Blvd.
Athletes should proceed to the track.

#### Parking for Buses

There will be limited bus parking in the main lot. Buses will need to back into the a designed spot against the wall due to space needed for other vehicles. If not parking remains, buses may proceed back to ABC Adult School Cabrillo Lane, 20122 Cabrillo Lane, Cerritos, CA 90703 (Across the street from Artesia High School). Parking may be available along Cabrillo Lane. If not, cars may park in the Cabrillo Lane parking lot. Please be mindful as other vehicles may be parking in the lot.

#### Parking for Spectators

Vehicles parking in the main lot of Del Amo Blvd. will be charged \$5 to help support Artesia High School. Parking spots are limited in this location which give you direct access to the course. Overflow parking is located at ABC Adult School Cabrillo Lane across the street from Artesia High School. This lot is our overflow lot. If parking in this lot, please be sure to NOT JAYWALK! Use the crosswalk at the nearest interaction (Pioneer & Del Amo). Neighborhood parking is also available, however, please park legally and at your own risk.




### Shoe Tag and Bib Instructions

You will be billed **\$10** for **each** shoe tag not returned today

Pay only \$5 for missing shoe tags, if you pay for them before you leave the meet

- 1. Inspect your team packet to ensure you received all your bibs and shoe tags
  - Immediately notify meet management if you are missing any bibs or shoe Tags
     Very important this must be done before leaving the packet pickup area
  - You will be responsible for any missing shoe tags after you leave the packet pickup area
- 2. Distribute your Bibs and Shoe Tags to all *competing* athletes
  - All athletes must wear their assigned bib & shoe tag, as assigned on your team roster
  - Athletes that are not registered should not use someone else's shoe tag
  - Failure to properly distribute the bibs & shoe tags will result in inaccurate results
- 3. Athletes must properly secure their shoe tag as shown below
  - Do NOT put the shoe tag in socks, in your pocket, etc
  - Be sure to Double Knot tie shoes



You are responsible for returning all of your shoe tags in numerical order before you leave the meet

- 4. Shoe tag Collection & Return
  - Each school is responsible for the collection & return of all their shoe tags
  - Tags must be returned in Numerical Order on the zip ties, the same as you received them o KEEP THE ZIP TIES UNLOCKED DO NOT CLOSE THE ZIP TIES
  - Use your team roster to ensure none of your shoe tags are missing
  - We suggest you use your team managers / assistant coaches to collect the shoe tags from your athletes after they cross the finishline there will no longer be any collection corral used
  - Have a COACH return all of your shoe tags to EVENT MANAGEMENT at the same location you picked up your team packet please refrain from sending an athlete to return shoe tags
  - Event Management will check your shoe tags with you for accuracy
